



High Weald Hero Activity Card

Recipe for a Woodland



Location: Woodland or on return to the classroom

Equipment: Drawing and colouring pencils, paper - 1 sheet per child

Time: 20 minutes

Audience: KS2

An activity to spark imagination and to encourage children to reflect on what they have learned

Activity Description: Give each child a piece of paper and ask them to imagine the perfect woodland. What would it contain? What types of plants or animals? On their piece of paper let them write about or draw their ideal woodland. Encourage them to share ideas. End with a discussion about whether their woodland is able to maintain itself year after year (e.g. consider food chains, use by humans, sources of water).



High Weald Teaching Point: The High Weald is a continually changing landscape that has been shaped by humans for thousands of years. How might the woods today change over the next century? TIP: Consider climate change, human impact, disease and animals - for example squirrel or deer.
