How is your deer management going this season?

With short days, wet weather and everything else needing your attention, finding time to manage deer impact on your land can be difficult.

We are already halfway through the fallow doe stalking season, so now is a great time to review progress with your deer stalker and update your deer stalking objectives for the remaining months.

Data Collection:

At the end of April we will be asking Farm Cluster members about their deer management results; this is part of the Farm Cluster objectives to



improve deer management in the landscape, so please start thinking about your data collection. If you are not sure what information to record on deer management, please look at our <u>sample data sheet</u> and <u>quidance</u>.

This is all good practice for future environmental stewardship, where land managers will be expected to monitor changes on the land and collaborate with their neighbours in improving the health of the land.
